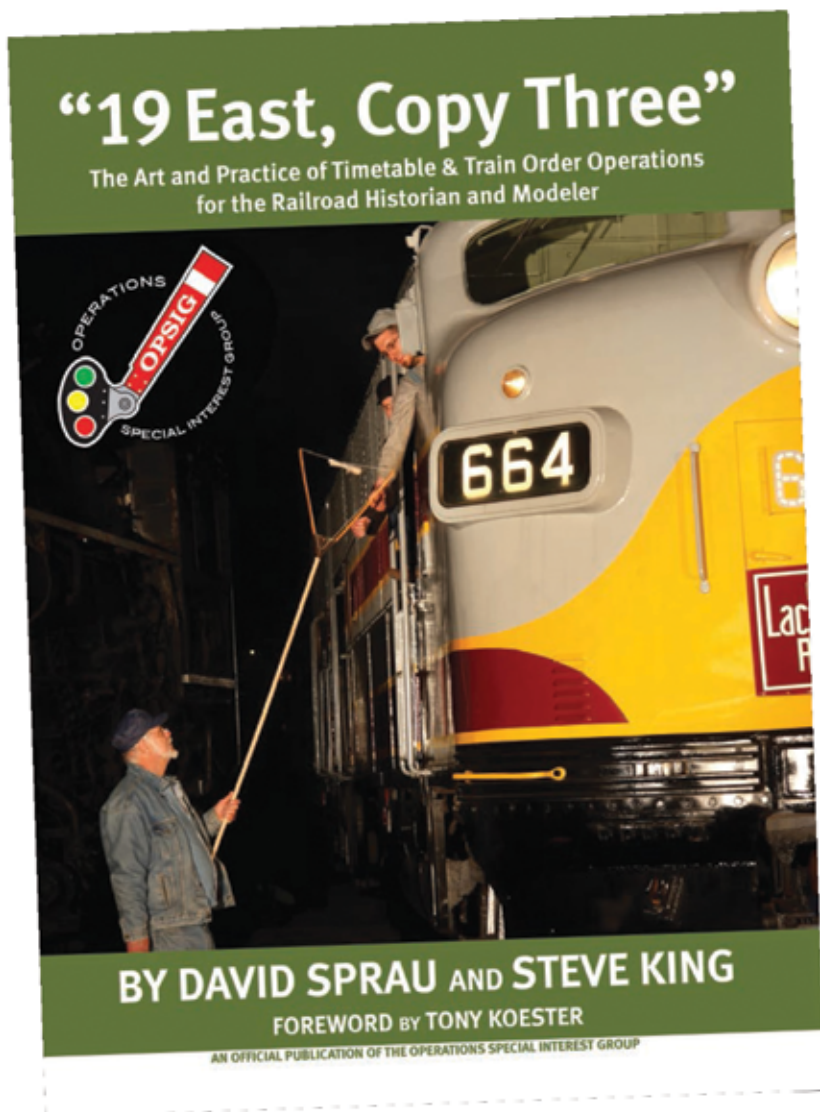


Second Section of "19 East, Copy Three" Has Arrived!
